- INITIATED BY EC OR DUTY EC
 - (MBQ, GWN, EH, SIG)
- MAY INCLUDE:
 - □ ON-AIR POLLING or
 - □ TELEPHONE FAN-OUT
 - If member unavailable only message should be "ARES called"
- REQUEST FOR WPGARES BY:
 - CITY OF WPG EMERGENCY PROGRAM:
 - WPG POLICE SERVICE
 - PUBLIC AID/EMERGENCY SOCIAL SERVICES
 - OTHER CITY DEPARTMENTS
 - PASPC (CANWARN)

CALL-OUT INITIATION con't

MEMO & gov't departments: thru MB ARES Duty Officer to EC or Duty EC

Mutual Aid requests: thru MB ARES Duty Officer

MB ARES Duty Officer currently could be WR, GLS, MBQ (usually MBQ)

"Local" NGO (e.g. Salvation Army):
Directly to EC or Duty EC
Must ensure no resource conflict with primary served agencies

READINESS

ARES ID CARD (carry at all times)

VEHICLE FUELLED / GAS-UP ON THE WAY

KNOW WHERE YOU ARE GOING document the assignment you received possess a Sherlock Map Guide

ARE FAMILY/WORK CONCERNS COVERED?

Does family know about ARES?
Have you discussed City letter with employer?*



READINESS con't

EQUIPMENT:

ARES BOX/BINDER AT HAND

(with you IN VEHICLE)

RADIOS PRE-PROGRAMMED (to Appendix 9.2)

HT AND SPARE BATTERIES

RESPONSE CONSIDERATIONS

CONSIDER AVAILABLITY
FAMILY, EMPLOYER, HEALTH

PROVIDE AVAILABILITY TO EC OR NCS

WHEN ASKED*:

READY NOW

READY LATER AT ____h

READY BUT NEED TRANSPORT

READY FOR SHORT PERIOD ONLY

DON'T SELF-DISPATCH, WAIT FOR OFFICIAL ASSIGNMENT

*INITIALLY EC AND NCS MIGHT BE SWAMPED GETTING SET UP BE PATIENT





NET CONTROL DUTIES

DUTY EC and OPERATOR

MAINTAINS WRITTEN LOG

Assigns Field Operators

Tracks all assignments & operators on/off duty

Documents communications sent/rec'd

Schedules reliefs

BRIEF INCOMING NCS OPERATORS*

TAKES DIRECTION FROM SERVED AGENCY LEADERSHIP



OUTSTATIONS

PROVIDE COMMS FROM POST TO NCS

COMMS FROM NCS TO AGENCY FIELD PERSONNEL

NOTIFY NCS ON/OFF DUTY

Need to fully brief relief operators

NOTIFY NCS IF DUTIES OR LOCATION CHANGE MAINTAIN WRITTEN LOG OF COMMS SENT/REC'D

ACCOUNTABILITY IS KEY


If assigned a job that you don't believe is safe or appropriate for ARES members contact Duty EC to discuss, **off the air** if possible.





ARES BOX & ARES BINDER

Concept of ARES Box and ARES Binder is **minimum** ARES equipment and documentation that you might require for an emergency call-out in **Winnipeg area**.

Different equipment list for rural deployments (available from MBQ)

Can be separate packages or all-in-one, e.g.: toolbox and briefcase, duffel bag, suitcase

Carry with you in the vehicle! Emergency Plan Appendix 9.3 & 9.4

Many lists around for what you should have in your go kit. Customize as you wish, use WPGARES lists as a **starting point** if nothing else. List in *TCA* (DEC 2001), large list in ARRL literature, see Appendices 3-5 Arlington County RACES Manual:

Useful Accessory

Hat Clip or "Napady" Clip to get HT antenna away from body when HT must be deep inside parka or rain jacket





Summary

Call-Outs

- Initiated by EC or AEC
- May include phone fan-out or just on-air polling
- Could be Emergency or "Planned"

Summary con't

Readiness & Response

- Have ARES ID card & equipment with you
 - □ Use 9.3 & 9.4 as equipment checklists
- Be certain of assigned location & role
- Consider capability to respond (Family, work, health, etc)
- DON'T SELF-DISPATCH
- Contact Duty EC if any conflict with served agency or tasking
